WHAP is a NPO and a registered PBO established in 1998 to ensure access to care, treatment and support services for persons within Winterveldt that are infected and affected by HIV/AIDS and other chronic illnesses. Winterveldt covers an area of about 14x14 square kilometres with an estimated 750,000 inhabitants. The level of unemployment is 70% and about 10% of the population is infected with HIV/AIDS and TB. The project's main scope is the provision of home-based care services to the community. WHAP also seeks to strengthen community mobilisation and create an enabling environment for the prevention of HIV/AIDS.
